


Papers receiving a smiley face, check mark, star, or sticker has been completed for practice only and is not recorded in the grade book

Reader's Workshop

- •Fiction text including fables, folktales, and poems
- •Non fictional text including more integration of science and social studies materials.
- •Determining the main idea, comparing texts, elements of a story, understanding graphic features, questioning, connections
- Word study: sight words and word patterns

Word Work

- Alternative approach to traditional spelling instruction
- Focus on word patterns vs. memorization of unconnected words
- "A word study program is a cohesive approach that addresses word recognition, vocabulary, and phonics as well as spelling (Zutell, 1992)."
- Students don't just learn to spell words, they learn about words
- Some emphasis on Greek and Latin roots
- Focus on forming generalizations they can apply to words they want to read or spell



Writer's Workshop

Writing:

- Study, understand, and create personal narratives, informational and persuasive writing.
- Developing a clear idea and supporting details
- Developing a clear beginning, middle and end
- Developing styles including describing actions, feelings, settings, characters
- Produce work that is grammatically correct and utilizing revising skills

Grammar:

 Nouns, proper nouns, capital letters, types of sentences, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, commas, contractions, compound words, abc order, and dictionary skills.

Math

Topics we will be learning about:

- Number Sense
- Understanding place value, including the IOOO's place
- Addition and subtraction—including 3 digit with regrouping
- Measurement-including time, metric and standard units
- Geometry (2D and 3D shapes)
- Fractions as parts of a whole
- Money-coins & bills (counting change back from a dollar)
- Problem solving
- Developing multiplication


